PfHU - Uganda projects

Am very glad to report to you that PfHU has once again fulfilled its commitment and love to the people of Kititi village through food relief and other basic needs during this long and difficult period of Covid-19. A very huge thank you to those kind souls in UK and Sweden who have offered to donate in support of these vulnerable and desperate families, children, men and women whose lives have become so difficult ever since the government halted socio-economic activities.

This state of affairs has greatly affected many families here who are struggling to figure out how to make ends meet. In conjunction with the local Covid -19 task force we managed to deliver 120 food packages (rice, maize flour, salt, matches and soap) to the affected families within Kititi community and around -mainly targeting the sick, elderly, single mothers and very poor homesteads who continue to wallow in hunger.

Vulnerable people including all the immigrants from the nearby submerged landing sites around Lake Victoria whose incomes were already low are some of the worst hit by the economic downturn have also benefited from this food relief program and will continue doing so in the next few weeks.

PfHU has worked so hard to support and help these people even in this time of crisis, this is a great achievement and it makes PfHU programs so worthwhile in this community. We appreciate all the generous funders and well-wishers who have stepped forward to support the most vulnerable with essential food and hygiene items.

I wish to inform you that through financial donations to PfHU -Uganda we have been able to procure medicines for our community clinic during this period of malaria upsurge due to much rains. The changes in seasonality have caused too much malaria cases. I must admit as for now there is a reduction in bed net ownership and low immunity among children and women in the village. Nurse Daphne has been working so hard to treat the patients at the clinic with artemisinin-based combination therapy and using rapid diagnostic tests something which has worked well to treat and heal those who get sick with this deadly malaria.

On behalf of everyone in the village, I would like to thank you all for your generous financial contributions. We promise to keep you updated of our progress.
