Lovely people, friends and supporters of PfHU work. Hope you had a lovely Christmas. May this year bring new happiness, new goals, new achievements, and many new inspirations to your lives. Wishing you a year fully loaded with happiness.

Christmas food parcels

So far so good, all families under PfHU program received their Christmas food and essential parcels. We harvested sweet potatoes which were earlier on planted by the cooperative ladies in the village. Betty the farm manager also gave us some 2 pigs and a goat which we slaughtered and shared amongst the cooperative ladies.

Over 160 food parcels have been delivered to very needy families and in total we have reached over 450 people in those families. This is the beauty of loving and supporting people within their families. The impact multiplies quickly and a huge difference is made.

All rationing and packaging was done at PfHU control office at Hope house and then Apollo and his team of Cooperative women observing Covid-19 measures safely reached out to families one by one delivering food parcels. It was indeed a great opportunity to bring Christ's love into people's homes.

Health situation during festive season

The PfHU clinic has been fully operational treating the local community in Kititi. Dr. Baker and nurse Daphne have been happily providing primary medical care including appropriate malaria treatment and testing, dispensing and conducting health and hygiene education talks to our Kititi people. The most common illnesses still in Kititi are malaria, typhoid, cough and flu and pneumonia. Of course other serious conditions like HIV/AIDS are always referred to Kyanamukaaka Health center (Government facility) which is 4 miles from Kititi village. Our blue truck is always on standby to respond to any emergencies in the village.

New Year school opening

All schools to reopen in January 2021 according to the latest release from the Ministry of Education –Uganda. This implies Cornerstone primary school will be open to our children in January. Children and teachers are very excited to be back to school. However, the same ministry has put Standard Operating Procedures which have to be strictly followed as a means to control and curb the spread of Covid-19 spread in schools. These include; availability of WASH facilities, the two-meter distance between learners and ensuring good ventilation.

Other SOPs include; regular disinfection, restricted community access, supervising break periods, and scattered release of students for breaks, lunch, and departures to limit interaction. Am happy to report to you, in Kititi village we have been observing these SOPs and come January, the same observations will be carefully implemented in Cornerstone primary school.

It's my humble request to the PfHU Trustees to facilitate as always Cornerstone primary school with all the necessary requirements and supply to ensure a smooth reopening and running throughout the term.
